

THE PRATT COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MET MONDAY, MARCH 9, 2020 AT 4:00 P.M. IN THE COURTHOUSE COMMISSION ROOM WITH THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS PRESENT: THOMAS W. JONES III, GLENNA L. BORHO AND JOE R. REYNOLDS. TYSON EISENHAUER, COUNTY COUNSELOR, GALE ROSE, PRATT TRIBUNE REPORTER, SHERRY KRUSE, COUNTY CLERK AND DARRELL SHUMWAY WERE ALSO PRESENT.

THE MEETING WAS OPENED WITH THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

SHERIFF WHITE REPORTED HE IS PURCHASING ANOTHER 2020 TAHOE FOR AROUND \$43,000 COMPLETELY EQUIPPED; WILL TRADE-IN A DODGE DURANGO; COMMISSIONERS ASKED HIM TO START GETTING ROOF AND WINDOW BIDS.

BILLY HAMPTON, PRATT COUNTY FIRE & RESCUE CHIEF, REQUESTED A TEN-MINUTE EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS NON-ELECTED PERSONNEL; COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION AT 4:02 P.M. TO ADJOURN INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION FOR TEN MINUTES TO DISCUSS NON-ELECTED PERSONNEL. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. COMMISSIONER BORHO MADE A MOTION AT 4:05 P.M. TO RETURN FROM EXECUTIVE SESSION WITH NOTHING TO REPORT. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. COMMISSIONER BORHO MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE \$5220 YEARLY FOR FOUR OFFICERS OF PRATT COUNTY FIRE & RESCUE. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

DOUG FREUND, ROAD&BRIDGE/LAKE DIRECTOR, DISCUSSED FEMA PAYMENTS FOR THE SEPTEMBER 2018 FLOOD; DEBRIS CLEAN-UP AND FISH CLEANING STATION HAVE ALL BEEN DONE BUT STILL SOME ITEMS LEFT AND THEY HAVE BEEN PAID FOR A FEW; THE INLET/OUTLET LARGEST LAKE PROJECT COMES WITH MORE STIPULATIONS; FEMA WANTS THE COUNTY TO SEND BACK PAYMENTS ON THE SMALL PROJECTS AND THEN GET ONE CHECK FOR ALL PROJECTS; DEADLINE IS APRIL 13, 2020 AND DOUG SAID HE HAS FILED FOR AN EXTENSION; GRAY STONE FOR CAMPING SPOTS WILL BE \$33,000 TO \$35,000; DOUG REPORTED HE IS NOW WORKING WITH KDEM ON THE OCTOBER 2018 FLOOD.

ROBERT TORRES, NOXIOUS WEED/ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, REPORTED THEY ARE STARTING TO SPRAY BARE GROUND TOMORROW; INITIALLY THEY WANTED TO START TODAY BUT TOO WINDY; THEY ARE BUSY WITH SEPTIC TANKS AND WATER WELL CHECKS.

TIM BRANSCOM, EMERGENCY MANAGER/ZONING ADMINISTRATOR, REPORTED THEY HAD 65 PEOPLE AT THE STORM SPOTTERS MEETING LAST WEEK.

SCOTT HARRIS, EMS DIRECTOR, SUBMITTED ANOTHER YEAR END REPORT WITH COMPARISONS BETWEEN 2019 AND 2018; SCOTT DISCUSSED THE PURCHASE OF A REPLACEMENT FOR THE 2001 CHEV SUBURBAN THAT WAS TOTALED BY HAIL; PREVIOUS BIDS INCLUDED A FORD EXPLORER WHICH SCOTT REPORTED IS TOO SMALL AND THE OTHER VEHICLE HAS BEEN SOLD; REQUESTING TO PURCHASE A 2019 CHEV TAHOE AT \$46,705.98 FROM SUPERIOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE VEHICLES, ANDOVER, KS WITH 30 DAY DELIVERY; THIS VEHICLE IS ALREADY FULLY EQUIPPED; COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION TO PURCHASE A 2019 CHEV TAHOE FOR \$46,705.68 FROM SUPERIOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE VEHICLES, ANDOVER, KS OUT OF THE AMBULANCE-SPECIAL EQUIPMENT FUND. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. SCOTT AND DARCIE VAN DER VYVER, HEALTH DIRECTOR, DISCUSSED THE CORONAVIRUS.

DARCIE VAN DER VYVER, HEALTH DIRECTOR, REPORTED SHE HAS ORDERED TESTING KITS FOR THE CORONAVIRUS; TESTING KITS WILL BE SENT TO KDHE AND THERE IS A 24 HOUR TURNAROUND; THEY ARE STAYING IN GOOD COMMUNICATION WITH THE HOSPITAL, EMS, SHERIFF, MEDICAL DIRECTOR, LOCAL CLINICS; CONSIDERED LOW RISK RIGHT NOW; REVIEWING WEEKLY WEBINARS AND GETTING INTERNET UPDATES DAILY; 2020-2021 STATE GRANTS HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED; CUREMD THINKS THEY CAN GO LIVE ON APRIL 1ST; REQUESTED PERMISSION TO CLOSE ON MARCH 23, 24, 26, 27, 2020 FROM 8:00 A.M. TO 11:00 A.M. FOR TRAINING; COMMISSIONERS APPROVED THE REQUEST.

COMMISSIONER BORHO REPORTED THAT JASON WINKEL, LANDFILL/RECYCLING SUPERVISOR, WAS ILL; JASON WANTED THE COMMISSIONERS TO KNOW THAT THE LANDFILL STARTED THEIR SUMMER HOURS THIS WEEK; MONDAY-FRIDAY 9:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M. AND SATURDAY 8:00 A.M. TO 1:00 P.M.; ALLIED ENGINEERING VISITED THE LANDFILL AND CELL C NEEDS ANOTHER 2-3 FEET DUG OUT; SCALE HOUSE IS OPERATIONAL.

COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MARCH 2, 2020 MEETING. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

COMMISSIONERS SIGNED A LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR THE PRATT HEALTH COALITION TO APPLY FOR A BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD KANSAS PATHWAYS HEALTHY KANSAS GRANT.

COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION AT 4:45 P.M. TO RECESS TO THE COURTROOM ON 3RD FLOOR FOR THE AT&T SU-2019-04 HEARING AT 5:00 P.M. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

CHAIRMAN JONES CALLED THE RECESSED MEETING TO ORDER AT 5:00 P.M. IN THE 3RD FLOOR COURTROOM AND REMINDED THE AUDIENCE THE MEETING WAS BEING RECORDED. CHAIRMAN JONES ASKED THAT COMMENTS BE LIMITED TO NEW INFORMATION.

THOSE IN THE AUDIENCE WERE MORGAN TRINKLE, DEA BROWN, GARY TRIMPE, CHRIS LOVELL, TIM BARKER, RICHARD HOWARD, RANDY HUITT, ROBERT A. BLASI, GLEN KLOCKES, DARIN MILLER, DARRELL SHUMWAY, ROBERT AHRENS, IAN KOVACH, LARRY D. FENWICK, RICK SHRIVER, GALE ROSE.

THE MEETING WAS RECORDED AND AVAILABLE FROM TIM BRANSCOM, ZONING ADMINISTRATOR.

GLENDA CAFER, AT&T COUNSEL, REPORTED THAT SHE HAD TALKED WITH HER CLIENT IN AN EFFORT TO RELOCATE THE TOWER; THEY WORKED DILIGENTLY TO WORK SOMETHING OUT WITH THE AIRPORT AUTHORITY; HER CLIENT IS WILLING TO LOWER THE HEIGHT OF THE TOWER BUT THAT DOES COMPROMISE WHAT AT&T WAS TRYING TO DO; MS. CAFER SAID THEY ARE AMENDING THE APPLICATION AND PULLING THE VARIANCE REQUEST; BOB BLASI COMMENTED HE SERVED 16 YEARS ON THE AIRPORT AUTHORITY BOARD AND SAFETY WAS THE #1 THING THAT THEY STRIVE FOR AT ANY HEIGHT; ROBERT AHRENS WANTED TO CONFIRM THAT AT&T WAS OFFERING TO LOWER THE HEIGHT OF THE TOWER? AS LONG AS FAA DOESN'T CHANGE THE MINIMUM, HE WAS OK WITH IT; MR. AHRENS THANKED THE COMMISSIONERS FOR TRYING TO BRING BUSINESSES INTO THE COUNTY; IF FAA DOES CHANGE THE MINIMUMS THEN WE WILL NEED TO GO BACK AND RE-THINK THINGS.

TIM BRANSCOM, EMERGENCY MANAGER/ZONING ADMINISTRATOR, READ THE OPTIONS THE COMMISSIONERS HAVE: #1 MOVE TO ADOPT THE FINDINGS AND FACTORS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PLANNING BOARD TO DISAPPROVE CASE NO. SU-2019-04; #2 MOVE TO OVERRIDE THE PLANNING BOARD'S RECOMMENDATION AND APPROVE CASE NO. SU-2019-04 BASED UPON APPROVAL OF WITHDRAWN VARIANCE AND AMEND IN DETAIL THE FINDINGS AND FACTORS SUPPORTING THE MOTION IN THE SPECIAL USE REPORT; #3 MOVE TO RETURN THE RECOMMENDATION TO THE PLANNING BOARD ON CASE NO. SU-2019-04 FOR FURTHER CONSIDERATION AT ITS NEXT REGULAR MEETING WITH A STATEMENT SPECIFYING THE BASIS FOR THE BOARD'S CONCERN WHETHER TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE RECOMMENDATION; #4 MOVE TO TABLE CASE NO. SU-2019-04.

COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS COMMENTED THAT HE DIDN'T THINK THE BOARD HAD A RIGHT TO STOP THE PROJECT; COMMISSIONER BORHO SAID STATE AND FEDERAL REGULATIONS KEEP THEM FROM DISAPPROVING THE CASE; TYSON EISENHAEUER, COUNTY COUNSELOR, REMINDED EVERYONE THEY ARE NOT TALKING ABOUT THE HEIGHT OF THE TOWER TODAY; CHAIRMAN JONES ASKED IF ANYTHING CAME OUT OF THE MEETING AT&T HAD WITH THE AIRPORT AUTHORITY? GLENDA CAFER STATED THAT THEY DID HAVE A MEETING TODAY AND THAT SETTLEMENT NEGOTIATIONS WERE UNDER A NON-DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT; COMMISSIONER BORHO MADE A MOTION TO OVERRIDE THE PLANNING BOARD'S RECOMMENDATION AND APPROVE CASE NO. 2019-04 BASED UPON APPROVAL OF A WITHDRAWAL OF THE VARIANCE AND AMEND IN DETAIL THE FINDINGS AND FACTORS SUPPORT THE MOTION IN THE SPECIAL USE REPORT. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. TIM BRANSCOM REMINDED THE COMMISSIONERS THEY NEEDED TO AMEND FACTOR #10; COMMISSIONER

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BORHO MADE A MOTION TO AMEND THE SPECIAL USE REPORT FACTOR #10 TO THE PROPOSED TOWER WOULD PROVIDE MORE CELL COVERAGE FOR THE AIRPORT AND ADJACENT AREA AS WELL AS BEING PART OF THE NATIONWIDE FIRSTNET SERVICE FOR FIRST RESPONDERS. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. COMMISSIONER BORHO MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE RESOLUTION NO. 03-09-20 APPROVING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A COMMUNICATION TOWER IN THE A-1 AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT ON CERTAIN LANDS LOCATED IN PRATT COUNTY, KANSAS, UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE ZONING REGULATIONS OF THE COUNTY. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

TIM BRANSCOM, EMERGENCY MANAGER/ZONING ADMINISTRATOR, STATED THAT PERSONS AGGRIEVED BY THE FINAL DECISION OF THE BOARD ON THIS MATTER HAVE 30 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTUATING RESOLUTION IS PUBLISHED WITHIN WHICH TO APPEAL TO DISTRICT COURT.

COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION TO RECESS THE MEETING AT 5:15 P.M. TO THE 1ST FLOOR COMMISSION ROOM. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION TO RETURN TO THE REGULAR MEETING AT 5:23 P.M. IN THE 1ST FLOOR COMMISSION ROOM. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

GALE ROSE, PRATT TRIBUNE REPORTER, ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS TO ANSWER SOME QUESTIONS CONCERNING INFORMATION HE HAD RECEIVED FROM DWIGHT ADAMS ON THE PUBLIC SAFETY CENTER PROJECT; GALE SAID HE WAS GIVEN TWO PAGES; ONE WAS THE FIRST PAGE OF A CONTRACT WITH LANDMARK ARCHITECTS AND A SECOND PAGE WITH THE ARCHITECTS ESTIMATE OF THE COST OF THE BUILDING; GALE WANTED TO VERIFY THAT IT HAD NOT BEEN PUT OUT FOR BIDS; COMMISSIONERS SAID THE PROJECT IS STILL IN THE PLANNING STAGES AND THAT FUTURE ANNUAL PAYMENTS OF \$1.5M FROM THE NEXTERA WIND FARM PROJECTS WILL BE USED TO FUND THE PROJECT; TYSON EISENHAUER, COUNTY COUNSELOR, TOLD GALE THAT WE ARE NOT TRYING TO HIDE ANYTHING FROM THE PUBLIC THAT MORE INFORMATION WILL BE COMING AND AVAILABLE IN OPEN SESSION; DARRELL SHUMWAY ASKED IF APRIL WILL BE WHEN CONTRACTS WILL BE LET AND THE COMMISSIONERS SAID WE HAVE NO TIME LINE YET; TYSON EISENHAUER SAID THE COMMISSIONERS WILL LET EVERYONE KNOW WHAT'S HAPPENING; COMMISSIONER BORHO TOLD GALE THAT WE APPRECIATE HIM WANTING TO GET ALL THE FACTS STRAIGHT.

COMMISSIONERS RECEIVED A LETTER FROM DWIGHT ADAMS CONCERNING THE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING; COMMISSIONERS WILL DEFER ANY ACTION TO A LATER DATE.

TYSON EISENHAUER, COUNTY COUNSELOR, REQUESTED A 20-MINUTE EXECUTIVE SESSION FOR ATTORNEY/CLIENT PRIVILEGE; COMMISSIONER BORHO MADE A MOTION AT 5:30 P.M. TO ADJOURN INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION FOR 20 MINUTES FOR ATTORNEY/CLIENT PRIVILEGE. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. COMMISSIONER BORHO MADE A MOTION AT 5:50 P.M. TO RETURN FROM EXECUTIVE SESSION AND GO BACK INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION FOR ANOTHER TEN MINUTES FOR ATTORNEY/CLIENT PRIVILEGE. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0. COMMISSIONER REYNOLDS MADE A MOTION AT 6:00 P.M. TO RETURN FROM EXECUTIVE SESSION WITH NOTHING TO REPORT. COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

COMMISSIONER BORHO SECONDED. MOTION CARRIED 3-0.

CHAIRMAN JONES CALLED THE RECESSED MEETING OF MARCH 9, 2020 TO ORDER AT 1:00 P.M. ON MONDAY, MARCH 16, 2020 FOR A JOINT MEETING WITH THE CITY COMMISSIONERS. ALL MEMBERS WERE PRESENT ALONG WITH TYSON EISENHAEUER, COUNTY COUNSELOR AND SHERRY KRUSE, COUNTY CLERK. CITY COMMISSIONERS PRESENT WERE GARY SCHMIDT, MAYOR, DOUG MEYER, DON PETERS AND ZACH DEEDS. CITY COMMISSIONER LESLIE WAS ABSENT. LOU KRAMER, CITY CLERK, BRUCE PINKALL, CITY MANAGER, REGINA PROBST, CITY ATTORNEY AND DIANA GARTEN, CITY FINANCE DIRECTOR WERE PRESENT. GALE ROSE, PRATT TRIBUNE REPORTER AND DARRELL SHUMWAY WERE ALSO PRESENT.

TIM BRANSCOM, PRATT COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGER/ZONING ADMINISTRATOR, DARCIE VAN DER VYVER, HEALTH DIRECTOR, SHERIFF WHITE, SCOTT HARRIS, EMS DIRECTOR, BILLY HAMPTON, PRATT COUNTY FIRE & RESCUE CHIEF, SHERRY BESSER, PRMC SAFETY OFFICER AND PAUL CARRINGTON, PRMC DIRECTOR OF QUALITY AND INFECTION CONTROL DISCUSSED THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC; TIM BRANSCOM SAID HE HAD QUESTIONS FROM CITY PERSONNEL; ARE KEEPING IN CONTACT WITH KDHE, KDEM AND OFFICIALS AT THE STATE AND LOCAL LEVELS; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER REPORTED SHE IS LISTENING TO KDHE WEEKLY UPDATES; RECEIVING GUIDANCE ON WHO TO TEST; DON PETERS ASKED IF THE TEST INVOLVED A SWAB OF NOSE AND THROAT WHICH DARCIE SAID THEY ARE TESTING FOR BOTH THE FLU AND CORONA VIRUS; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER SAID HOSPITAL AND STATE LABS HAVE RESULTS WITHIN 24 HOURS; DON PETERS ASKED IF YOU SHOW SYMPTOMS JUST SELF QUARANTINE?; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER SAID YOU SHOULD CALL YOUR PRIMARY CARE PHYSICIAN; PAUL CARRINGTON SAID LAB CORP CAN ALSO RUN TESTS WITHOUT APPROVAL FROM KDHE; DOUG MEYER ASKED ABOUT THE COST AND PAUL CARRINGTON SAID INSURANCES SHOULD PAY \$50 AND STATE TESTING IS FREE AND STANDARD COURIERS ARE FREE; DOUG MEYER ASKED IF IT WOULD ESCALATE TO DRIVE-THRU TESTING; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER SAID YOU SHOULD CALL AHEAD DURING OFFICE HOURS AND THEY WILL COME OUTDOORS TO YOUR CAR AS TO STILL PROVIDE PRIVACY; IF IT COMES TO MASS TESTING THEY WILL OPEN UP THE TOWNSHIP 12 BUILDING AND USE TWO LANES TO PROCESS PATIENTS; SEVERAL YEARS AGO THEY HAD AN EXERCISE THAT USED THIS PROCEDURE; PAUL CARRINGTON SAID TO REDUCE EXPOSURE TO PEOPLE WITH NO IMMUNITY OR ANTICIPATE GETTING SICK QUARANTINE STRATEGY IS TO SHELTER IN YOUR OWN HOME; IF YOU DEVELOP PNEUMONIA THAT REQUIRES ANTIBIOTICS; GLENNA BORHO ASKED IF SHORTNESS OF BREATH WAS MAIN DIFFERENCE AND PAUL CARRINGTON SAID IN CHINA OF THE 72,000 CASES 30% HAD SHORTNESS OF BREATH BUT 98% WERE COUGHING; DON PETERS ASKED IF THERE WERE ENOUGH VENTILATORS AND PAUL CARRINGTON SAID THE HOSPITAL HAS ENOUGH OR THEY CAN REQUEST MORE IN AN EMERGENCY; SHERRY BESSER SAID THEY WORK WITH THE FIRST RESPONDERS IN PRATT COUNTY; DOUG MEYER ASKED WHAT HAPPENS IF STAFF IS QUARANTINED AND SHERRY BESSER SAID SOME STAFF CAN STILL PROVIDE CARE; TIM BRANSCOM SAID THEIR SOUTH CENTRAL KANSAS REGIONAL COALITION CAN ASSIST; DOUG MEYER COMMENTED SOME FIREFIGHTERS IN NEW YORK HAVE BEEN QUARANTINED; PAUL CARRINGTON SAID QUARANTINE DOES MAKE IT DIFFICULT BUT WOULD PULL STAFF FROM OTHER AREAS OF THE HOSPITAL; PAUL SAID IT HAS BEEN DISCUSSED TO ELIMINATE ELECTIVE SURGERIES; TIM BRANSCOM SAID WE NEED TO LIMIT CROWDS AND HE HAS ALREADY BEEN GETTING QUESTIONS ABOUT SOME EVENTS; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER SAID THAT AS OF LAST NIGHT CROWDS OF NO MORE THAN 50; REGINA PROBST SAID THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS GET TO DETERMINE RESTRICTIONS; CITY IS LOOKING AT WHO IS RENTING THEIR FACILITIES AND THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO WILL BE THERE; TYSON EISENHAEUER SAID THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER CAN DETERMINE MANDATORY NUMBERS; SHERIFF WHITE WAS CONCERNED ABOUT WHO WAS GOING TO ENFORCE MANDATES; TYSON EISENHAEUER SAID THE COUNTY WOULD BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ENFORCING; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER SAID SHE IS USING PRESS RELEASES, PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS, WEBSITE & FACEBOOK TO PROVIDE INFORMATION; REGINA PROBST SAID THE HEALTH OFFICER DETERMINES WHETHER IT IS RECOMMENDED OR MANDATORY; BRUCE PINKALL SAID THEY ARE PLANNING AHEAD AND NOTIFYING PEOPLE WHO WOULD BE USING THEIR FACILITIES; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER HAD ASKED DR. CANNATA TO BE HERE BUT HE

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HAD OTHER COMMITMENTS; PAUL CARRINGTON EXPLAINED FLATTENING THE CURVE STATING THAT LESS CASES BUT FOR LONGER PERIOD OF TIME IS THE OBJECTIVE; REGINA PROBST SAID THE YMCA'S IN WICHITA HAVE CLOSED; PAUL CARRINGTON SAID THE PARENTS WHO WORK AT THE HOSPITAL ARE ASKING WHAT TO DO WITH THEIR CHILDREN; IT'S A DELICATE BALANCE; GARY SCHMIDT ASKED IF THE SAME SOURCES COULD BE USED FOR NOTIFICATIONS THAT WE USE FOR TORNADO WARNINGS; TIM BRANSCOM SAID HE WOULD REACH OUT TO WICHITA NEWS STATIONS AND MASS NOTIFICATION SYSTEM; DOUG MEYER SAID THINGS ARE CHANGING EVERY MINUTE AND THAT EVEN WALMART OR DILLONS WOULD HAVE MORE THAN 50 PEOPLE AT A TIME; SOME RESTAURANTS ARE CLOSING WITH ONLY CARRY OUT OR DELIVERY; GLENNA BORHO SAID EVEN WALMART HAS CHANGED THEIR HOURS; REGINA PROBST COMMENTED THEY ARE WRITING TICKETS AND GIVING 60 DAYS FOR PAYMENT; DARCIE VAN DER VYVER SAID STATE RECOMMENDS 14 DAY ISOLATION BUT THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WILL NOT BE ABLE TO TURN AWAY SERVICES FOR SOME PATIENTS; TIM BRANSCOM SAID THE STATE HAS ISSUED A DECLARATION THAT THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WILL CONSIDER AT THEIR MEETING AND DURING A CONFERENCE CALL WITH THE STATE YESTERDAY UTILITY COMPANIES ARE EXTENDING COLD WEATHER RULES; GLENNA BORHO DISCUSSED OPERATION RED FILE WHICH IS A FREE RED FOLDER ENVELOPE FOR SENIORS FROM THE SOUTH CENTRAL KANSAS AREA AGENCY ON AGING TO PUT HEALTH INFORMATION IN AND AVAILABLE FOR EMERGENCY RESPONDERS IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY; TIM BRANSCOM SAID IN THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN IF THE HOSPITAL IS FULL THE HOSPITAL HAS AGREEMENTS IN PLACE TO USE THE ARMORY; MOBILE HOSPITAL IS ALSO AN OPTION; WE HAVE 750 LEVEL B SUITS; THEY ARE OUTDATED BUT STILL USABLE AND 2000 MASKS; DON PETERS ASKED WHAT THEY DO WITH THE USED SUITS AND TIM SAID THEY CAN BE THROWN AWAY; TIM BRANSCOM SAID THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN IS DUE IN AUGUST AND HE WILL NEED TO COLLABORATE WITH THE COUNTY AND CITY OVER THE NEXT COUPLE OF MONTHS.

TO 2:00 P.M. AT THE COURTHOUSE, FOR PRATT CLEAN SLATE DAY; IF SOMEONE NEEDS HELP CLEARING THEIR PRATT COUNTY OR MUNICIPAL CRIMINAL RECORD; THIS IS A PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE PRATT COUNTY ATTORNEY, PRATT MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY, KANSAS LEGAL SERVICES AND PRATT DISTRICT AND MUNICIPAL COURTS FUNDED THROUGH THE KANSAS BAR FOUNDATION CRHA GRANT PROGRAM; LOCAL ATTORNEYS WILL HELP FILL OUT THE PAPERWORK.

DON PETERS ASKED TO BE UPDATED ON THE PROGRESS OF THE LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER; GLENNA BORHO SAID WE ARE WAITING ON SPECS FOR WINDOWS AND TOLD SHERIFF WHITE TO GO AHEAD WITH ROOF BIDS; DON PETERS ASKED ABOUT THE COST OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING EAST OF TOWN AND THAT IT IS PRATT COUNTY TAXPAYER MONEY BUT SO MANY MORE THINGS WE COULD DO WITH THAT MONEY; GLENNA BORHO SAID IT IS NOT TAX MONEY IT'S WIND FARM PAYMENTS AND THE ARCHITECTS ESTIMATE WAS \$6.9M; DON PETERS WANTED THE CITIZENS TO HAVE INPUT; TYSON EISENHauer SAID THE ONLY THING SO FAR WAS SIGNING A CONTRACT WITH THE ARCHITECT AND THE COMMUNITY WILL BE PROVIDED INFORMATION WHEN WE GET IT BUT WE ARE NOT THERE YET; DON PETERS SAID THE CITIZENS OF PRATT COUNTY DON'T LIKE THE LOCATION AND THAT KIND OF
